



Our vision is to unlock and reveal the hidden heritage of the Westmorland Dales, enabling more people to connect with, enjoy and benefit from this inspirational landscape.


Objectives:

Distinctly Westmorland Dales

We will work with local tourism businesses to help them promote and encourage enjoyment and understanding of the Westmorland Dales' unique character and landscape.

This will include tourism businesses on the fringe of the scheme area in Shap, Tebay, Appleby and Kirkby Stephen as these are key gateways to the Westmorland Dales.
