

Status of South Lakeland Local Plan Policies

The South Lakeland Local Plan was first adopted in 1997 and an altered version was then adopted in 2006.

Some of its policies were superseded by the 2010 Core Strategy and 2013 Land Allocations Development Plan Document. When South Lakeland District Council adopted its Development Management Policies in March 2019 the whole of the remaining 2006 Local Plan policies were superseded but only in relation to the parts of South Lakeland outside of the National Park.

These remaining policies, set out in the schedule below, continue to remain relevant to the parts of South Lakeland District that became part of the Yorkshire Dales National Park on the 1st of August 2016 i.e. the whole of the parishes of Barbon, Casterton and Middleton and the relevant parts of the parishes of Firbank, Grayrigg, Killington, Kirkby Lonsdale and Mansergh.

They still form part of the legally adopted Development Plan for these areas and can still be given due weight in planning decisions according to their degree of consistency with:

- subsequently published national policies and guidance, notably the [National Planning Policy Framework \(2018\)](#) and [National Planning Practice Guidance](#).
- subsequently adopted local planning policies, notably the [South Lakeland Core Strategy \(2010\)](#) and [Land Allocations DPD \(2013\)](#).
- any other relevant legal requirements

The policies will remain part of the adopted Development Plan for these areas until superseded by a new National Park-wide Local Plan in or around 2023.
